## INTRODUCTION

The US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires regular point-in-time counts from all the entities engaging in the Continuum of Care grant-making process. Beginning in 2003, the Continuum of Care application has required continuums to report on the number of people who are homeless in their community. HUD requests that communities perform a point-in-time count every other year, beginning with 2005. As part of this request, all continuums nationally are required to perform a point-in-time count the last week in January. The State of Utah performed a point-in-time count on the evening of January 23, 2007.

The homeless service providers recognize and understand that the need for accurate and unduplicated homelessness data is essential for planning purposes, policy and program development, and for recognizing the service gaps in the delivery system. The data collected from these surveys also provides viable information that can be used to facilitate the State's goal to end chronic homelessness in 10 years.

Counting the number of homeless people is a complicated process. Beginning in 2004, Utah conducted its first homeless street count in conjunction with the sheltered point-in-time survey. This year, the count was done in shelters and transitional housing units as well as a survey used to count the number of homeless persons living on the street, in parks, viaducts, in cars, etc., and, therefore, provided a more complete picture of homelessness.

One significant challenge of obtaining a complete picture of homelessness is counting people who move in with family or friends, known as "doubling up", or move from home to home (couch-surfing). This is more prevalent in rural Utah where shelter services are limited or nonexistent. According to HUD's current definition, a person is considered homeless if they are living in a place not meant for human habitation, housed in an emergency shelter, or a transitional housing unit. Therefore, those "doubled up" with family or friends or "couch surfing" are not included in this definition and count. It is also important to note that point-in-time counts tend to under-represent the homeless population because they tend not to capture those who experience only brief episodes of homelessness.

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Utah Point-in-Time count of the homeless was conducted the evening of January 23, 2007. The State of Utah, Department of Community and Culture contracted with the Salt Lake County Homeless Coordinating Council, Inc., (SLCHCC) to be the lead agency on the Point In Time count. The SLCHCC with the help of homeless service providers, homeless clients, and volunteers throughout the state conducted the count. This count provides a “snapshot” of homelessness in Utah on a single day. A total of 87 agencies participated in the statewide Point-In-Time count; fifty-four agencies participated in the survey monkey and 33 agencies participated in the street count survey.

Point-in-time surveys enable a projection of annual levels of homelessness to plan for unmet needs, provide the data necessary for homeless service providers as well as state entities to secure federal funding for the homeless, and to help plan for appropriate levels of permanent supportive housing. The data collected from these surveys also provides viable information that can be used to facilitate the State’s goal to end chronic homelessness in 10 years.

### **Total Count**

- There were 2,573 sheltered homeless persons and 280 unsheltered homeless persons counted on January 24, 2007, for a total of 2,853 individuals.

### **Sheltered Point-in-Time**

- Of the 2,573 sheltered homeless, 1,536 were unaccompanied adults and 37 were unaccompanied youth for a total of 1,573, and 1,000 were members of sheltered families.
- Of sheltered individuals, 588, or 30.7%, were most affected by substance abuse, 328, or 17.1%, by mental illness, 202, or 10.56%, were veterans, 209, or 10.9%, were victims of domestic violence and 558, or 29.1% were Other/Unknown.
- A total of 485 individuals were identified as sheltered chronically homeless and 280 as unsheltered individuals for a total of 765 chronically homeless individuals. This number of represented 26.8% of the total homeless count.
- Parents of homeless families were distinctly different from unaccompanied individuals: 56, or 14.85%, of the parents were substance abusers, 43 or 11.41%, of the parents were mentally ill, and 126, or 33.42%, of sheltered homeless families were homeless because of domestic violence.
- 617, or 21.62%, of the sheltered homeless population in Utah were children.

- 531, or 86.06%, of children in families lived with a single parent.
- There were 84 two parent families and 277 single parent families with 16 individuals as a couple.
- 1,542, or 59.93%, of the sheltered homeless population were single men.
- Of the entire population of sheltered homeless persons counted (unaccompanied individuals, parents/couples, children), 74.8% were White, 6.25% were Black/African American, 22.05% were Hispanic, .59% were Asian/Pacific Islander, 3.18% were American Indian/Alaskan Native, .51% were Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander, 1.38% were American Indian/Alaskan Native & White, .35% were Asian & White, 1.02% were Black/African American & White, and .39% were American Indian/Alaskan & Black/African American and 1.52% were Other Multi-Racial or Unknown. This compares to Utah's approximately 90 percent White, 1 percent African American, 10 percent Hispanic, and <1 percent Native American population statewide.
- 1,861, or 72.3%, of individuals of the sheltered homeless population were located in the Salt Lake County Continuum of Care, 82 or 3%, of individuals were in Mountainlands, and 630, or 24.4%, of individuals were in the Balance of State.

### **Unsheltered Street Count**

- There were a total of 280 unsheltered individuals counted. All of these individuals were unaccompanied and there were no individuals in families reported.
- 165, or 58.9%, of the unsheltered homeless unaccompanied individuals were located in Salt Lake County, 29, or 10.35%, were located in Mountainlands, and 86, or 30.71%, were located in the Balance of State.
- There were no unsheltered families enumerated in the State of Utah's three continuums.
- The drop in unsheltered numbers from 434 in 2006 to 280 in 2007 were due to very cold weather conditions throughout the state and 50 more individuals were in shelter in 2007 than in 2006. Also, Mountainlands reported on individuals from the soup kitchens in 2006 and by asking additional questions this year regarding where they slept the night before, the numbers dropped from 158 to 29 because many of the individuals were staying with family or friends.

**Memo:**

A count of homeless persons was conducted on January 23, 2007 at hospitals, jail/prisons, and the homeless children in each school district. The counts were as follows:

- 19 homeless persons were patients in local hospitals
- 233 persons were in the jails/prisons
- 7,430 homeless children, from kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> grade, were counted in Utah Schools.

Due to the lack of affordable housing in Duchesne and Uintah Counties, 193 individuals were living in motels and 371 RV sites were counted as one individual even though there are probably more one are living in the RVs. These individuals are not supported by any funding from homeless agencies.

Unsheltered homeless individuals are considered to be chronically homeless.

## METHODOLOGY

### **Shelter Count**

Salt Lake County Homeless Coordinating Council, Inc. developed an electronic survey (Survey Monkey) that included questions about sheltered homeless individuals, families, and unaccompanied youth. The draft survey was distributed to the Local Homeless Coordinating Committee (LHCC) chairs and co-chairs at the Utah Homeless Summit held in November 2006. Several revisions were made to incorporate Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) data collection. The survey monkey was reviewed by several homeless service providers from each of Utah's three Continuums for feedback before distribution to statewide agencies.

The survey was developed and distributed largely through an online survey service, though hard copies were also distributed to all service providers, to give them the option of mailing or faxing their responses. The survey monkey was distributed to all agencies in the State of Utah that provide emergency shelter and/or transitional housing services, as well as other agencies who provide motel vouchers or other forms of temporary shelter. Agencies were identified primarily through their respective Continuums of Care. Organizations outside of the LHCC and the Continuum of Care process were identified through 211 Referral Service and other community contacts. The point-in-time for which data was collected was January 24, 2007.

A total of 56 agencies, with 74 programs, were contacted to participate in this sheltered count survey. In order to ensure that data had been collected from all agencies surveyed, all were encouraged to respond even if they did not serve anyone on January 24th. Only those agencies that indicated they were no longer providing shelter services were excluded from the survey results. As surveys were returned, responses in subcategories were compared to totals reported by agencies. In instances where the sum of subcategories did not equal reported totals, follow-up phone calls were made to clarify all ambiguous responses. Once all responses were clarified, the data from all three Continuums were compiled at the state, Continuum, regional and county levels.

This report illustrates the demographic client information on unaccompanied sheltered homeless individuals ages 18 and over, sheltered families including parental and child information, and unaccompanied sheltered children ages 17 or younger. For the purposes of this survey, a homeless individual was defined as a single individual, 18 years or older, a homeless family was defined as a two parents or single parent with children or a couple without children, and an unaccompanied child was defined as an unaccompanied child, 17 years or younger. A clear definition of chronic homelessness was described in the survey and agency respondents were asked to determine how many of the unaccompanied individuals they served met the definition of chronic homelessness. Disability subcategories were requested to gain an increased understanding of those considered to be chronically homeless.

The chart of the special population (mental illness, substance abuse, veteran status, etc.) is an unduplicated count, although many of the individuals deal with multiple problems. Respondents were asked to select a single HUD subpopulation category for each homeless adult. An “other” category was added so that all homeless adults could be categorized. This is considered a “throwaway” category, which was included only to compare subcategory responses to the agency’s reported totals. Similarly, because some agencies do not, or can not, collect complete demographic information about each of their clients, “unknown” and “other” categories were included as an option in every question.

Finally, in an effort to get an indication of the unsheltered population, respondents were asked to report on the number of clients not served: defined as those turned away or put on a waiting list. Because no attempt was made to find out where such individuals ended up for the night, it cannot automatically be assumed that they met HUD’s definition of homelessness<sup>1</sup>. Responses are reported exactly as received, without attempting to verify or otherwise re-check these responses. Not all agencies keep records of individuals turned away, and as such many responses are estimates. Therefore, this information should be employed with some caution when being used to determine actual need vs. gaps in the Continuums of Care.

<sup>1</sup>In general, HUD considers an individual to be homeless if she or he spends the night in a shelter or sleeps in places not meant for human habitation such as cars, parks, sidewalks, or abandoned buildings or condemned buildings. For more specific information, see HUD’s website:

## **Street Count**

The street count committee consisted of representatives from all 3 continuums, homeless service agencies and representatives from the Division of Housing and Community Development. Initial meetings were held to determine survey questions and protocol standards and a decision was made to utilize the same protocols that were employed at last year's count. Some of the survey questions were taken from the Florida Coalition for the Homeless and combined with last year's street survey to meet the specific needs of our differing continuums.

A total of 33 agencies participated in the street count survey.

In Salt Lake County, meetings were held with community volunteers to organize counts in various parts of the county. Community volunteers and volunteers from various homeless service agencies and the community were assigned specific locations and received copies of the survey a week prior to the count. Surveys were copied on purple paper so duplication could be identified by asking the individual if they had filled out a purple survey earlier that day. Local police and sheriff departments were contacted to solicit their assistance to identify sleeping sites for homeless people in their areas. The Salt Lake Police Department identified ten abandoned buildings and homes to be counted. They were also invited to participate directly in the street count process. The various Salt Lake County police departments and the Volunteers of America/Utah Homeless Outreach Program were extremely helpful in identifying potential areas of habitation for the count.

The Balance of State and Mountainlands Continuum of Care worked with the LHCCs to identify regional representatives to conduct the count. The regional representatives contacted local police and sheriff departments, food programs, DWS branch offices, local community action programs, libraries, public school districts, Veterans Administration Centers and any local non-shelter services and instructed them about the purpose of the count and solicited their assistance and participation. Due to the fact that the areas outside of Salt Lake County are primarily rural, the survey was conducted a week in length with the question "where did you sleep the night of January 23rd?" to avoid any duplication in the numbers. The surveys were also color coded to avoid duplication of responses. In some areas local police or sheriff offices jointly assisted in reporting on any homeless people found on the date of the count. Many parts of Utah experienced extremely cold weather the night of the count so there were few individuals sleeping outdoors.

In Salt Lake County, volunteers returned their surveys to the Salt Lake County Homeless Coordinating Council immediately following the count for compilation of the data collected. The Balance of State agencies reported total numbers and kept the surveys in case there were any questions on totals.
